Jesus appoints the 12 apostles (Luke 6:12 – 6:19)

12 In these days he went out to the mountain to pray, and all night he continued in prayer to God.

13 And when day came, he called his disciples and chose from them twelve, whom he named apostles:

14 Simon, whom he named Peter, and Andrew his brother, and James and John, and Philip, and Bartholomew,


15 and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon who was called the Zealot, 16 and Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.

17 And he came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the seacoast of Tyre and Sidon,

18 who came to hear him and to be healed of their diseases. And those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured.

19 And all the crowd sought to touch him, for power came out from him and healed them all.

Jesus aligning kingdom's values (Luke 6:20 – 6:26)

20 And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said:

“Blessed are you who are **poor**, for yours is the kingdom of God.

21 “Blessed are you who are **hungry** now, for you shall be satisfied.

“Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh.

22 “Blessed are you when people **hate** you and when they **exclude** you and **revile** you and **spurn** your name as **evil**, on account of the Son of Man!


23 Rejoice in that day, and leap for **joy**, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers did to the prophets.

24 “But woe to you who are **rich**, for you have received your **consolation**.

“Woe to you who **laugh** now, for you shall **mourn** and **weep**.


26 “Woe to you, when all people speak **well** of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets.







There are two kinds of happiness


Happiness because one lives for the King is eternal,





Jesus says “To one who **strikes** you on the cheek, **offer** the other also”

Jesus fulfilled all that he had taught

Now the men who were holding Jesus in custody were **mocking** him as they **beat** him. 64 They also **blindfolded** him and kept asking him, “Prophesy! Who is it that struck you?” 65 And they said many other things **against** him, **blaspheming** him. (Luke 22:63-65)

“Father, **forgive them**, for they do not know what they are doing”. (Luke 23:34)

57 At this they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices, they all rushed at him, 58 **dragged** him out of the city and began to **stone** him. Meanwhile, the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul.




Jesus teaches kingdom's actions (Luke 6:37 – 6:42)

37 “**Judge not**, and you will not be judged; **condemn not**, and you will not be condemned; **forgive**, and you will be forgiven; 38 **give**, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you.”

39 He also told them a parable: “Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? 40 A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher. 41 Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? 42 How can you say to your brother, ‘Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye,’ when you yourself do not see the log that is in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take out the speck that is in your brother's eye.



Jesus teaches kingdom's actions (Concerning judging others)



Jesus taught:

37 “**Judge not**, and you will not be judged; **condemn not**, and you will not be condemned; **forgive**, and you will be forgiven; 38 **give**, and it will be given to you.

Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap.


For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you.”

Think Kingdomly

- We break this command when we often assume the worst of others.
- We break this command when we judge a person's character only by their worst moments.
- We break this command when we assume “the hidden motives” of others.
- We break this command when we judge others without considering ourselves in their same circumstances.
- We break this command when we judge others without being mindful that we ourselves will be judged.



Jesus teaches kingdom's actions (Luke 6:37 – 6:42)



How about evaluation and discernment?


- We should only judge another's behavior when we are mindful that we ourselves will be judged,
- and we should consider how we would want ourselves to be judged.

Jesus reveals that we are generally far more tolerant to our own sin than we are to the sin of others.

Jesus teaches self-assessment (Luke 6:37 – 6:42)

43 “For no good tree bears bad **fruit**, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit, 44 for each tree is known by its own **fruit**. For figs are not gathered from thornbushes, nor are grapes picked from a bramble bush. 45 The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.

- **fruit** is the inevitable result of who we are.
- Our words reveal our heart. If there is **good treasure** in the heart, it will show; if **evil**, that also will show in time.





Jesus teaches self-assessment (Luke 6:37 – 6:42)

46 “Why do you call me ‘Lord, Lord,’ and not **do** what I tell you? 47 Everyone who comes to me and **hears** my words and does them, I will show you what he is like:




