
# Focus

# The wilderness and the church – some parallels

- Wilderness a “type” or foreshadowing of the church
- Some parallels
  - “Two generations” – the faithful and the unfaithful – those who will enter the Lord’s rest and those who will not
  - In this world live as exiles and strangers, “sojourners” – 1 Peter 1:1, 2:11
  - Living between “Exodus” – deliverance – and the Promised Land - rest
  - Waiting for our full inheritance and taking possession of the “land” – being in our rightful place

# The wilderness and the church – some parallels (2)


- Some parallels (cont.)
  - But even in this world still receive many of our Lord's covenant blessings:
    - The descending of the glory of God - Acts 2
    - Living water of the Holy Spirit - Jn 4:7-15
    - True bread of life - Jn 6:22-59
  - We are organized as the Lord's people around the presence of the Lord
  - Live in a world of tribulation and difficulty - Jn 15:18-16:5
  - The Lord is with his people - Jn 14:15-18; Mt 28:20
  - We are led by our "warrior king"


# The problem

- The challenges and difficulties the Lord's people face in living in this world – a world that “hates” Jesus, his word, and his people
- The threat of being drawn into sin and idolatry.
- Failing to trust the Lord or to obey his word – of being unfaithful

in an unfaithful world?








# The issue of doubt

- The first generation
- Doubting the Lord's word – not trust him or his word
- So did not have a godly worldview and perspective of their situation
- Misinterpreted and misunderstood the extent and totality of reality and how they perceived and understood their life and meaning

# The issue of doubt (2)




- This will be the position of many today in the church - having a "worldly" worldview
- Fail/refuse to accept and trust the Word of God and to understand their life in this world in accordance with that Word
- Challenge for the faithful - the influence of worldly thinking


# Two things

- God exists and has spoken
- God is present among his people



# Living by faith is essential


- Being faithful requires accepting that God exists, that he has spoken, and has a plan and purpose for the world and our lives even though we may not see it
  - 2 Cor:16-18; 5:6-7
  - Heb 11:1
- First generation is an example of those not living by faith; are an object lesson to us – 1 Cor 10:6



# Living by faith is essential (2)


Questions:

- Do you believe the Word of God and wholeheartedly trust in it – even if there are those who don't?
- Is the Word of God the “lens” through which you seek to understand this world and your life?
- Is it your earnest desire to live fully in obedience with it?
- Does the Word of God distinguish your life from the ungodly world around you?




# Presence of the Lord

- Remaining faithful also requires that we remember that the Lord is present among his people in the “wilderness” and we are continually to orient our lives around him
- Significance - It is by his being present among his people that the Lord is able to communicate with them - giving his law and setting out his order of things
- For Israelites - the Tabernacle; for the Church - Jesus Christ (the word made flesh - Jn 1:1-4)



# Presence of the Lord (2)


- First generation - failed to remember this - did not continually orient their lives around the presence of God and rejected or neglected his word to them
- This is also the danger that the church faces today



# Presence of the Lord (3)

Questions:


- How do we continually orient our lives around the presence of the Lord as we live in this wilderness?
- How deal with the doubts and challenges that we face as we live in this world?



# Presence of the Lord (4)


Answers:

- Discipline - to seek the Lord daily and to organise our lives around him and his word
- Come daily to the place where the Lord speaks to us - his Word
- Necessity of meeting together regularly with the Lord's people - we live as a community not as hermits - we need each other in this wilderness
- Remember that the Lord shares our wilderness wanderings with us - he is with us



# Example of Phineas

- In comparison with Moses (Num 25:5)
- Trusted in the Lord's judgment and obediently followed it - he acted as the Lord directed (Num 25:7-8)
- Was faithful to the Lord and his word
- Jealous with the Lord's jealousy (Num 25:11) - jealous for God (Num 25:13)
- The people were blessed - Num 25:8, 11 (lifting of the plague and the Lord's judgment)
- This the precursor to the second census and the start of the people (second generation) being able to occupy the land

The question for us, therefore, is: "Do we believe the Word of God, and are we consistently willing to act upon it, whether or not it makes sense to those around us?"
