


## Keeping Our Inward Balances! (Ordering Our Private World!)

She recorded in her journal on one particularly draining and difficult day. Mary found herself trying hard to sleep in a crude jungle hut. She wrote...

"I'm not particular about my bed these days, but as I lay on a few dirty sticks laid across and covered with dirty corn-shells (in place of mattress), with plenty of rats and insects, 3 women and an infant 3 days old alongside, and over a dozen sheep and goats and cows outside, you should not be surprised that I hardly slept. But I had such a comfortable quiet night in my own heart..."




### Questions for Group Exploration


### 1. SERVICE & JOY!
